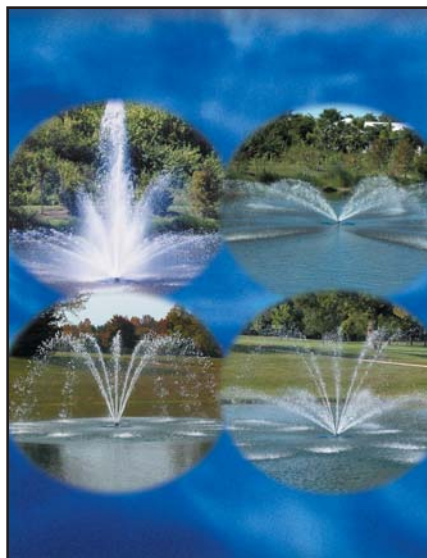

### About the cover

Fountain aerators create aeration by spraying water into the air. The fountain's spray absorbs oxygen, which is released when the oxygen-filled droplets strike the surface of the water. This continuing cycle of oxygen circulation and induced wave action prevents thermal stratification and supports aerobic bacterial action, resulting in clearer, cleaner, odor-free water. Fountain aerators are available in a variety of spray patterns.
